Call to Order – 7:29pm

Pledge of Allegiance – Moment of Silence observed in respect for those protecting our Freedoms and Safety

Secretary's Report – Dan Carlson – Nothing to report.

Treasurer's Report –Harry Rieter – December income \$2463.16 Expenses \$4422.57, major income \$1,400 new member dues, major expense \$2,000 preserve birds. Motion to accept was made and 2nd. Passed by vote.

Membership – Ron Breslawski – We accepted 8 new members last month. BOD approved 4 more for life membership at December meeting.

Bldg. and Grounds – Frank Petricone – Time to take tree stands down. The Polaris side by side will go to Maddie's for service on 1/20/23. The club road is in rough shape, please slow down and stay off the grass with your vehicles. Driving on the grass just makes a bigger mess. Trees have fallen around the property, be aware of broken branches overhead. The chainsaw in the barn uses a gas/oil mixture, use the oil in the small bottles by the chainsaw. Check and fill the bar oil reservoir before using.

If you don't know how to use and maintain the saw, please ask for help. Dan Spencer and son have already taken several trees down. Thanks, Dan.

Board of Directors Meeting January 19, 2023

Call to Order: 7:04pm, Nick Hardie

Board members present: Nick Hardie, Harry Reiter, Dan Carlson, Ron Breslawski, Dave Scorse, Frank Petricone, Al Castrechino.

Guests: Tim Hull from the Carpenter's Union. Has requested to reserve the club on September 16th. See notes below.

John Caloritis – prospective new member.

Secretary's Report – Dan Carlson – Both Jeff B. and Bruce N. are both on vacation for parts of the next two weeks. News Notes will most likely not be published until after the February 2 meeting.

Membership Report – Ron Breslawski – Ron introduced guest John Caloritis – a prospective member. John shared a short biography. A Motion was made to accept John into membership, 2nd, approved by vote.

Treasurer's Report – Harry Reiter – January Income – \$2,806, Expenses - \$3,291.05. Harry's report also included a summary of the post-Holiday shoot. Total income from the shoot was \$2,806 and total expenses was \$1,164.75.

Buildings, Grounds, and Equipment – Frank Petricone - The side by side is going to Matties' for service on 1/20.

Ranges - Sporting Clays Course - New traps. Frank received quotes for new Lincoln machines on the sporting clays course. Frank would like to start replacing the Pro-Matic machines and put them back at the 10-stand. The quote includes a full remote system for all the machines. Most all other clubs in the Hunter's Tour are wireless.

Frank plans to bring this up at the next general meeting. Discussion was held regarding a phase in approach or a replace all now approach. At the General Meeting, 2/2, Frank will propose approving the full quote for 4 Lincoln machines, 4 carts, and transmitters and receivers to convert all machines on the clays course to remote

operation was \$22,489.76. There will likely be some additional expense for lumber and covers for the traps. The whole project could likely be completed for \$23,000 or less.

Club Safety and Security – Outside lock for kitchen door – Project still on the table.

Preserve – Dave Isaac – Dave was not present, but he sent a report to Nick. It seems most interest in the preserve has dropped off quite a bit. Birds have been used for the year and the normal supplier is out for the season. The pen is empty and will likely stay that way until fall.

Misc Reports - Adopt-A-Highway, Camp Rushford, etc. – No updates.

New Business –

Carpenter's Shoot September 16th (proposed date pending the schedule of the Hunter's Tour). Nick recognized guest Tim Hull who is a friend of Dave Scorse. Tim is imagining a sporting clays event that is comprised of four man teams where everyone pre-registers and would hope for 80 shooters. Tim said their events usually include a cookout/banquet and this would most likely be catered. This would be their first time doing a sporting clays shoot. The event could start at 9:30am. Since pre-registration is required if the numbers get larger than 72, Tim will need to schedule a second relay 90 minutes later. The plan would be to have each station manned by a trapper. The BOD asked Tim to close registration in August. BOD quoted Tim an anticipated charge of \$17 per shooter fees and 50 person minimum. The union will collect money ahead and the treasurer will issue the club a check.

Reminder – The Ranges are closed during Club Shoots.

Nick received an email from the NRA for free membership for Active Duty Members of the US Armed Forces. Dan Carlson has the information if anyone is interested.

Rochester Rifle Club is doing a prone series this spring. Dan Carlson will follow up with more information on this at the February general meeting.
