Call to Order Ron Breslawski – 7:30pm Pledge of Allegiance – Led by Harry Reiter Moment of Silence Introduction of Guests – none recognized.

Members of the club qualify for Life Membership if they are at least 60 years old and have been active members in good standing for the last 10 years (see the Club Constitution Article 2 Section 4).

Bldg and Grounds – Frank reported. There are occasional problems with hornets around stumps that surround the club house. Mike K took care of this nest by the archery range. We should appeal to members who know how to remove stumps or consider other alternatives. Frank Castrechino will check on a contact and report back.

The chalet roof is done. Thank you, Frank P and those who helped. The floor of the chalet needs some work. There is a soft spot that needs to be reinforced.

Secretary's Report – Dan Carlson - News Notes published after BoD meeting. Please wear your name tags to general meetings!

Treasurer's Report – Harry Reiter – Income so far in October was \$3056.46, big income was dues for the preserve \$2300 and then black box for sporting clays \$417. Expenses so far \$747.77, big expenses were drinks and snacks for meetings \$260 and then dumpsters \$181.65. Motion made to approve, 2nd, and approved by vote.

Membership Report – Ed Breslawski – James Schaffer applied for life membership. He appears to meet the requirements. Motion made to approve, was 2nd, and approved by vote.

Military junior member inquired. Zane Endicott. Will be applying to upgrade his membership. He is on military leave until June and is hoping to join.

Buildings, Grounds, and Equipment – Frank Petricone – Please pay attention to the club rules. A member was found shooting early on Sunday (before 1pm) and had failed to sign in his guest. Please follow the rules even if you don't think anyone else is here.

Club Safety and Security — no updates Ranges:

Archery – Frank – Do we have too many 3-D animal targets? They seem to be clogging up the shed. We could auction them off to members. More 3-D courses in the future? Frank will talk to Dan Spencer about it.

Rifle – Frank – Please empty the garbage cans.

Ten Stand – Frank – No changes. No news.

Skeet – Frank - No new hornet or wasp nests. Frank also screwed down some of the outside boards on the low house that were warping.

Sporting clays – A great work crew on Saturday (10/14) got the whole course set up and ready. They even cancelled Sunday's work detail. Many stations or the stands were moved or adjusted. Thanks to everyone who helped. All set now for the Hunter's Tour. Dan Spencer will be making more score cards and bringing them to the shoot. The menu has not changed.

Hunter's Tour on October 21, 22. Breakfast will start about 6:30 or 7am for workers. Please plan to help if you are not shooting. We could really use someone to drive the tractor and wagon. Breslawski's will bring a porta-john to place out near the course.

Old business:

Adopt-a-highway: Steve Baase is willing to help with the Adopt-a-highway program. Ron talked to him, and Steve said he will reach out to Frank.

Hornets on the archery course. Mike K pulled the stump out and backfilled the hole with dirt. Thanks, Mike!

New business:

Ron brought up a concern with the life members rules in the Constitution. The waiting list will be extended dramatically if we follow the changes we made earlier this year. Most of the openings for new members are made by people going to life member status. Is this right for new members over 50? Should we open up the membership to 200 people? Lots of discussion was held regarding both subjects. Should we amend the 4B section of the Constitution to go back to 10 years? And we will recommend moving membership up to 200 active members (Constitution section 2A). We will recommend both to the general membership on 11/2.

Member Jeremy Toepper attended the meeting to ask about leasing the club to Rochester Personal Defense (Dave Jenkins). Dave is always looking for gun clubs to host his courses. He pays a range fee but unknown how much. Many of the club officers decided to pass on the idea due to concerns over liability and potentially making changes to the ranges themselves.

Motion to adjourn at 8:11pm. Motion was approved and 2^{nd} by vote.
